By supporting course work with a range of information resources, the library fosters student success in the classroom. This has included expanding our library orientation programming, research guide offerings, support of open hours in collaboration with Student Success Centers.

*Institutional Objective 1A: Increase enrollment of low-income and underrepresented students through intentional program development and targeted outreach efforts*

Library instruction strives to include resources that represent diverse perspectives which expand the student's knowledge and understanding of often underrepresented groups in the hopes that students will become open-minded, more compassionate community members. Furthermore, the Library fosters inclusion throughout the Cuesta community by offering events, outreach and support activities that center diversity, equity, inclusivity, accessibility, and social justice.

*Institutional Goals 2 and 3: Completion and Transfer*

The library's role in Open Educational Resources (OER) initiatives has helped to shift the campus culture regarding OER, significantly increasing the number of course sections using zero-cost and zero-textbook-cost (ZTC) materials from 32 sections in Fall 2021 to 98 sections in Fall 2022. Students earn higher grades and are more likely to complete courses that use OER, and students from underserved groups especially benefit from ZTC courses.

Library instruction also focuses on developing information literacy within specific disciplines and, more broadly, on developing the habits of critical reading that enable a person to evaluate the relevance, credibility, and quality of information sources and to use information effectively and ethically (such as News Literacy (Fake News)/Voting workshops). Through library instruction, students are equipped with the skills and knowledge to be effective consumers and producers of information in our current information ecosystem.

The library's student learning outcomes closely align with the informational fluency element of ILO 6:

"A Cuesta College information literate student is one who should know or be able to do the following:

- Conceptualize and communicate a research topic or information need and to know when expert assistance is necessary.
- Synthesize material and evaluate whether information need has been successfully satisfied.

Cuesta Library proposes buying the software product Alma Digital from our current Library Management System (LMS). This would serve as an add-on to our existing LMS catalog and other standard operating functions and allow us to digitize materials that we already own and have copyright to; Alma Digital would then allow these digitized materials to be searchable and show up in a search of our library catalog, just as a book title would be available for inclusion and use in campus Canvas course shells; be featured on our campus websites in galleries with topical focuses  
Three specific initiatives would be implemented in this Pilot Phase of Alma Digital:



Electronic Reserves—would directly benefit students by increasing access when students are not on campus

*Cuestonian* (Cuesta's Student Newspaper): Library has a complete collection of fragile, vintage hard copies from 1960 to 2012 when print publication stopped); this would preserve the brittle and acidic hard copies as well as making them searchable and accessible.

Other Library collections: For example, select materials from The Blythe Local History Collection (hard copy, housed at NCC Library); this would allow relevant items to be digitally accessed and used in California and other History Canvas courses. Our priority is to digitize primary sources regarding Latinx and African American residents of SLO County.

#### V. ANTICIPATED SERVICE CHALLENGES/CHANGES

Provide a brief description of challenges or changes anticipated in the next year and any needs that have emerged as a consequence.

There is an opportunity to integrate support programs throughout the division to meet student needs with increased workshops, tutoring, and group collaboration areas in the library. The ongoing shift to digital resources and the need to teach and support online will continue to outpace funding and remain a challenge. The high cost of textbooks (and the move to digital key locked editions) is prompting a move to digital reserves. OER low cost and zero cost initiatives will continue to influence the purchasing decisions of the library as it attempts to fill gaps in resource needs. Faculty retirements and the lack of technology focuses faculty willing to work as Part Time librarians will make it difficult to support needed technology. An increased need for technology support for students both in person and online will put pressure on existing staff. Lack of Spanish fluency among library staff will continue to cause underserving of ESL students.

##### Personnel

##### Librarian

We are underserving students and the local community by having a shortage of full-time librarians and having no Spanish-speaking librarians despite our status as a Hispanic-serving institution. [According to Title 5, based on our FTES, Cuesta should have four full-time librarians](#). Our backfilling with part-time librarians is not optimal or sustainable. The retirement of the Web librarian has made it difficult to update the library's website, Library Service Platform, Canvas site and other technology in a timely and effective manner.

### Full time Instructional Aid/Student Technology Support Specialist

Chromebook and Hotspot support needs have rapidly expanded with more classes online. Students are dropping out and failing due to lack of coordinated, proactive support. The digital divide is widening in this increasingly online environment, and in-person support can combat this. A support specialist is essential to maintaining support and offering ongoing training for students around technology.

There is a need for expanded technology support and training hours for the following duties:

- Tech support for students in person and online (chat and Zoom, canvas)
- Canvas support including add-ons, and support for in person students who must use canvas
- Support for software used in classes
- Document management across multiple computers, phones, programs, google doc
- helping students to understand faculty technology expectations
- My cuesta and cuesta website support
- Teaching workshops on technology and success topics
- Outreach across campus to students on tech support
- Liaison to campus departments that overlap with student technology (IT, Faculty Canvas support, ESS (registration)
- Hours in SLO and NCC LRC, Success Centers
- Bilingual
- Give feedback on student needs and emerging trends
- manage Chromebooks, hotspots and other technology (inventory, storage, support from IT, checkouts to students)

### Part-time, Bilingual Circulation Clerk at NCC

Since the return from the pandemic closure, the NCC has been unable to cover the circulation desk with student workers like it did previously. Faculty have been covering evening circulation and classified breaks and absences. We have no bilingual staff despite the large population of ESL students. This rises to a crisis situation for the first few weeks of each semester due to the rush of technology checkouts and new student orientations.

### **Instructional Materials:**

- Database/Etextbook funding to support lower cost textbook initiatives, increased online courses, and a general academic move to digital research. Library budget does not include database or reserve book funding; ACCJC Standard IIB 1 and 2 specify that libraries should have sufficient materials to support learning.
- Library Reserve Textbooks funding to support ZTC and lower cost textbook initiatives and increased online courses.

### **Noninstructional Materials:**

- Makerspace materials to support learning by doing and alternative evaluation methods in the classroom. Project based learning/evaluations is a method of addressing equity gaps. Library budget does not include funding for Makerspace, Open Educational Resources (OER) or Special Collections; ACCJC Standard IIB 1 and 2 specify that libraries should have sufficient materials to support learning.

- OER grants for faculty and to create zero-cost/low-cost courses and textbooks as well as funding to provide vendor published books as free class sets.
- Special Collections funding for archival materials to support the college archive as well as selective digitization of high value items from the Blythe California Collection. Creation, cataloging and preservation of oral histories of historically underserved members of the county as teaching and outreach materials
- Chairs for the Open Labs are dirty, outdated and need to be replaces

### **Technology**

- Open Lab computers need to be updated
- Printer software needs to be updated to allow online payments and use of financial aid and coupon funding
- Student Chromebooks, hotspots and laptops will continue to be needed and should be included in the technology replacement schedule.

### **Equipment/furniture (other than technology)**

- Wired furniture for NCC and SLO group Study Areas have been requested by students using the library.
- Replacement Chairs for the Open Labs
- Copier to print longer documents in NCC
- Scanners for digitization of reserve materials
- Movable group study furniture to support flexible learning environments.

### **Facilities:**

- Removal of unneeded print journal shelving; replacement with movable furniture will increase teaching and learning spaces in the libraries.
- The library supports Online Education's proposal of a faculty learning center (the ATTIC)
